We obtained your address from the Central Register of Foreign Nationals (AZR) or from the immigration authorities, and strictly use it to invite you to the survey.



How is your data protected?

Protection of your data is your right and thereby a very important topic for us. Anything that you say or write to us is treated as confidential information. We only analyse your data anonymously. All data protection regulations are observed.
