Scenario 2: Full customs import declaration You have been asked to process a full import declaration for goods not requiring inspection to a value of £1,000. The goods are being moved from Calais to Dover by ship. The goods will include 10 boxes at 10 kilograms each.	
Scenario 3: Safety and security entry summary declaration (ENS) You have been asked to process a safety and security entry summary (ENS) declaration for goods not requiring inspection to a value of £1,000. These goods are being moved from China to UK by ship. The goods will include 10 boxes at 10 kilograms each.
